Pantry Shortage

The Mission is a place that not only serves hot meals, but also has a small food pantry. Our guests can get the equivalent of a single meal to take with them since the Mission is not open for serving the dinner meal. Right now, our pantry is pretty bare. If you can help fill our pantry and fulfill some of the needs we are facing, it would be so much appreciated. We are in desperate need of protein items like cans of tuna, chicken, beef, or peanut butter. More options include cans of soup (best with pop-tops), cups of soup, single serve fruit cups, individual packets of oatmeal, protein drinks, soft breakfast bars, pop-tarts, and cases of water.

We are also in need of large cans of coffee (we go through about 1 or more per day), and other cold weather drinks such as hot chocolate, teas, and hot cider packets. Muffins or other breakfast pastries are also considered a huge blessing.
